2013 RACE REPORTS

CHAIRMAN'S REVIEW

The 2012/13 year was one of contrasts for the RACE Group. Financially, the year was one of disappointment. What had started as a year of some promise deteriorated for a variety of reasons, to result in both a book and a cash loss for our organisation. I won't dwell on the reasons for that result. They are very clearly explained in the report from our CFO Ryan Ayers, contained within this Annual Report.

Contrasting that disappointment though, our Group can look forward with optimism for the future. During the year the RACE Board, together with New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing and the Racing Industry Board undertook a review of its financial position and set about developing a strategy for the future of our organisation. Clearly, debt reduction is our immediate goal and that goal received a good deal of focus within the strategy. In addition however, it was clear that fundamental to the progress of our organisation would be the employment of a competent Chief Executive Officer to drive our strategy, and implement the plans set in that strategy. I am delighted to report that RACE has secured the services of Alasdair Robertson to undertake the role of Chief Executive Officer. Alasdair has had a very successful career, both in a variety of commercial enterprises and as the Chief Executive Officer of Perth Racing and the Melbourne Racing Club. Alasdair joined us in August. Since that time, he has taken a firm grasp on the issues that beset RACE and has set about with energy and enthusiasm to set up RACE's plans for the future. Asset restructure plans have been resolved, presentations have been made to the individual Clubs within the RACE Group, a proactive approach to sponsorship has been established and communication with all of our interest groups has been intensified. I am delighted with the progress Alasdair has made to date and believe that the Board can look to a positive future for our organisation.

MANAGEMENT

I am indebted to Ryan Ayers, Darin Balcombe, Brent Wall and Chris Allen for the assistance that they have given me during the year and for the efforts that they have made on behalf of our organisation. They operate in a difficult environment but have discharged their duties in an admirable fashion. I would also like to thank them for their positive embrace of Alasdair Robertson as their CEO.

CATERING

RACE continues to operate catering activities both at Awapuni (Creative Catering) and at Trentham (Trentham Gardens). Creative Catering continues to be a valuable contributor to RACE Group income. Trentham Gardens continues to have difficulty reaching the potential that the RACE Board considers the business to have. In the coming months, it's the Board's intention to give careful consideration to how that business can be improved, so that it realises its potential and becomes a valuable contributor to our Clubs.

COMMITTEES

My gratitude is also extended to the Committees of our member Clubs. They have continued to work hard for the success of RACE and their dedication, enthusiasm and devotion is to be applauded. Their efforts to secure attractive sponsorship continues to reward RACE and its member Clubs.

RACING

From a racing perspective, RACE continues to excel and to exceed in racing performance terms compared to other racing organisations within New Zealand. Our Club conducts 11% of the thoroughbred racing conducted in New Zealand. We attract however 14% of the thoroughbred racing betting turnover invested in New Zealand and our stakes continue to be more than competitive.

None of this could be achieved without the combined contributions of the Board, our member Clubs, our RACE staff, our strong and loyal band of sponsors and the facilities that we are able to offer.

While our race meeting profit for the year was something of a disappointment, in comparison to other racing organisations in New Zealand, RACE continued to out-perform the industry as a whole.

The racing conducted by member Clubs was of high quality and produced some exciting viewing. Final Touch was the star of this year's racing, having won both the Captain Cook Stakes and Telegraph Handicap at Group 1. Additionally though, Historian won the Thorndon Mile, Nashville was successful in the Otaki-Maori Weight for Age, More Than Sacred succeeded in the New Zealand Oaks and Recite was successful in securing victory in the Manawatu Sires Produce Stakes. O'Fille also won the Cuddle Stakes and Manawatu Breeders Stakes. Trainers and jockeys from the region also had their share of success and kept our region to the fore.

Lisa Latta's training performance was a highlight in coming a very close second to Michael Pitman in the Trainers Premiership.

GRAND OAKS

While I have mentioned that I do not intend to delve into the financial aspects of our year in too much detail, I need to report that recently RACE sold the last of its sections in the Grand Oaks subdivision and as a result of these sales was able to make a significant reduction in our indebtedness to the Bank of New Zealand. The rapid escalation in sales in the Grand Oaks subdivision was incredibly pleasing to your Board and I would like to make special mention of the efforts that Graeme Martin made to promote section sales and bring a number to conclusion. A significant number of sections were sold without our having to pay real estate agents commission because of the assistance provided by Graeme.

THE YEAR AHEAD

While our 2012/13 result makes disappointing reading, there is significant enthusiasm within your Board for the 2013/14 year. Further debt reduction initiatives are planned. A number of parties have been engaged and are showing considerable interest in the offerings being made. We are optimistic that a number of those initiatives will come to conclusion within the next 12 months.

That optimism aside however, it is clear that considerable work is ahead of us before the future of our organisation can be secured. That will require significant input from your Board, our member Clubs, our staff and other stakeholders. To secure our future, it is a question of determining priorities but it is clear that the state of many of our facilities and plant and equipment means that we have an uphill battle in providing prestige

racing facilities to attract quality sponsors, horses and crowds. That shortcoming has been well acknowledged in the Board's strategy for the future. Our competition is such that unless we focus on providing first class racing surfaces and public facilities, we will continue to suffer. Once our debt burden is resolved, attention will be given to those concerns.

PRESIDENT’S REPORTS

MANAWATU RACING CLUB (INC)

My fourth and final year as president, and in reflection, my two personal commitments and priorities again, was the retirement of debt and the maintaining of sponsorship, and it gives me personal satisfaction in reporting that both were achieved, and all sections are sold, averaging \$200,000 each. Six sections were sold in 2009, four sold 2010, two sold 2011, five sold 2012 and twelve sold 2013. There was no commission paid on 13 sections, as they sold via the club. This has reduced our debt by about four million.

We are looking at a different strategy for the development of Te Wanaka Road; The PNCC approved residential rezoning for City West. This would give us the opportunity to develop the third and largest subdivision of 200 sections; they would have reduced our entire debt. They have now done a complete 180 degree turn and go north to Kelvin Grove, all because of the liquefaction issue, but we will be challenging this all the way.

It's pleasing to report that sponsorship at Manawatu has been very good. We have focused on maintaining our most valued partners as well as adding some new sponsors during the year. All races at Manawatu were sponsored with different degrees of cash input. Again I would like to thank all sponsors for their contributions, especially The Oaks Stud for their very generous contribution to New Zealand's richest Group One 2YO race, also John McOviney from Steelfort/Lawnmaster, Bernie Higgins from the Green Machine Higgins, the Gillespie brothers from Ezibuy, Brendan and Leonie Hapeta from Hotel Coachman and the Fell Family from Fairdale and Goodwood Studs, for their generous and continuing support.

The highlight in the racing year was the Group One Oaks Stud Manawatu Sires Produce Stakes won by there filly Recite. She was owned and bred by The Oaks Stud owner , Dick Karaman who came out from Australia to witness the race ,an unbeatable personal breeding achievement ,owning the complete package. Recite is by Darci Brama out of Chant who

was by Traditionally, which is all Oaks Stud horses, has that ever happened in a group 1 race in Australasia? The Group Two, Lawnmaster Awapuni Gold Cup was the first of two feature wins for trainer Jason Bridgeman with Better Than Ever. He also won the Listed Fairdale/Goodwood Flying Handicap with Burgundy. We also saw an impressive display from Survived in the Group 3 Higgins Manawatu Classic on the day.

It's my belief that the thoroughbred racing is strangled by the flawed racing act, Section 16 and the distribution of profits, gained from the thoroughbred industry. Unless this is amended, the thoroughbred industry will not get its fair returns on profit. It is difficult to foresee strong growth and sustainability in the near future, given that our profits from our NZ racing product is distributed to the harness and greyhound codes.

Our management team of Brent Wall Darin Balcombe Ryan Ayers and Chris Allen, have kept the ship afloat in very hard times. They have kept the facts and figures and have always been professionally presented to the Race Board. Also the office staff have done an incredible amount of work behind the scenes , and I thank them all.

After 38 years of involvement 33 at committee level and 10 years as Vice President, I sign off the last four years as your President. I hand over the reins to Rex Fell of Goodwood Stud. I am offering my self for re-election as a committee member ,and will be an alternate on the Race Board. I would also like to wish Craig Sheridan the best for the future as he steps up to Vice President and acknowledge Brian Hope who is stepping down from the Committee after sixteen years of committed service to the Club.

FEILDING JOCKEY CLUB (INC)

The 2012/13 season again saw the Feilding Jockey Club run 3 exciting and successful meetings which have been well supported by our members, sponsors and the general public. Both our main meetings host \$50,000 listed races which adds an extra prestige to the day. With this level of stakes, horses and jockeys are attracted from around the country.

Again we made a good contribution to the Group with a race meeting surplus of \$89,000 which was both up \$2,000 on budget and \$9,000 on last year. Our oncourse turnover, one of the few areas where we can increase returns, whilst \$36,000 below budget was on a par with the previous year.

These successes can’t be achieved without the efforts of your committee, our sponsors and from our members and supporters. Our sponsors give us tremendous support with all our races sponsored and other business groups bringing large groups to entertain on the day. This has seen good crowds turn up to our main two meetings and on Feilding Gold Cup day we had every venue full with happy racegoers.

As usual we began the season with our marquee day, the Feilding Gold Cup meeting. This is our biggest profile day of the year with our best stakes on offer and fits well within the Spring racing pattern. Again we were pleased to have Ricoh partnered as our sponsor of the Feilding Gold Cup. As usual, space was at a premium in the Silks Lounge and other function rooms with a strong Cup field including a number of Northern horses and the strongest available Central District stayers. The Courtesy Ford Redcraze Bowl kicked off the main events with a strong win by the highly regarded Lady Kipling. She went on to win at Group II level and place at Group I during the season.

Next up the Ricoh Feilding Gold Cup provided one of the most exciting finishes seen at Awapuni with three horses locked together across the line and the judge unable to separate the first two. Dead heaters Jeu de Cartes and Savvy Dancer both trained in the Waikato and both promising horses. Jeu de Carte won the Counties Cup at her next start. Third place getter with a late surge was ex-Wellington Cup winner Spiro, only a nose back.

Our ANZAC day meeting was subject to a heavy track but is always popular, being a compact 8 race programme. The Manawatu ITM ANZAC Mile was taken out by a local, Testa Secret, trained by Kevin Gray with a group of owners including 2 All Blacks in Jason Eaton and Conrad Smith. They, with their other owners, were on track to see the victory with Conrad doing the honours at the presentation.

The Club’s last day of the season is an industry day, these days back to 8 races. Mark Pickford successfully promotes this as a

building industry contractor’s day with good support from our local building industry. Mark has led the way by showing how to make use of these mid-week days by working on a particular theme. This day returned one of the best mid-week results of any of our Group days and was well above budget.

There are always plenty of people to thank for their input in creating a successful jockey club and exciting race days. Firstly to my hard working committee and their wives and partners, thanks for your efforts, particularly our Vice-president Darrin Holm and our sponsorship manger Mark Pickford. Mark continues to set the bar for us in his efforts to get our sponsors on board and this is seen in our fully sponsored race days. Our mid-week “contractors day” is a great example with what would otherwise be a low key day at the races. I would also like to thank the RACE staff at Awapuni especially Ryan, Brent, Tineke and Chris who we work closely with and who are always ready to assist.

The last but not least thanks goes to our sponsors, to our main race sponsors Ricoh & Manawatu ITM who have now supported us for some seasons, the individual sponsors of races and the business house sponsors at our ANZAC Day meeting. Your input is invaluable to us both from the funding point of view and the added excitement they add to the day with the people they bring along.

As part of the RACE group, we continue to operate with a challenging financial position. It is great to see the completion of all the Grand Oaks section sales which will see further reductions in debt, but there is still plenty of work ahead to further improve our Balance Sheet. To further improve our race day experience, further reinvestment in facilities is needed but this can only happen with lower debt and improved cash flows.

I would also like to welcome our new CEO, Alasdair Robertson. Al brings a wealth of experience gained around the world with leadership roles, both in the commercial and racing sectors. With Al and our leadership team, the Group is well placed to put our future plans in place.

We are a unique industry with both the reliance of paid staff and the many hours put in by unpaid committee people who have a love of the sport. With the continuing good work from our committee, continuing support from our sponsors and the support of our community, we will continue to do put on exciting race meetings and enjoy doing it.

RANGITIKEI RACING CLUB (INC)

While the Rangitikei racing club again had a successful 2012 / 2013 season, the racing industry continues to face many significant challenges. The country’s economic times are still very trying with the racing industry focusing on cost control and maximising the recreational dollar.

The Rangitikei Racing Club held two very successful meetings this season. The November meeting would have an on course turnover of \$40,123 and achieve a racemeeting profit of \$14,198. The Bulls Country Cup, which continues to be sponsored by Scully’s products, was run over 2100 metres and won this year by Flemington, owned and trained by Lucy Tanner from Awapuni.

Our main meeting in May saw the running of the James Bull Rangitikei Gold Cup over 1600 metres which is sponsored by the renowned Bulls racing family, who have guaranteed a minimum stake of \$50,000.00 for the cup over the next few years. A field of 12 contested the cup which resulted in a win for the talented mare Sacha, trained by Lisa Latta and ridden by Darryl Bradley. This combination also won the race last year with Zennista. The race day turnover was \$103,065. This produced an excellent racemeeting profit of \$44,965. This was largely attributed to the outstanding turnout of our sponsors in the Silks Lounge.

The above results reflect the hard work of our committee and we are once again indebted to our sponsors for their continuing support of our race day meetings. With Gerry Scully again in charge of sponsorship for the season and with his ongoing drive and enthusiasm along with the support of our loyal sponsors, we saw the Silks Lounge filled to capacity. During the year, the club held a dinner for our major sponsors at The Coachman Hotel, which was enjoyed by all who attended.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Chris Allen, Brent Wall, Ryan Ayers, Darin Balcombe and the staff of RACE for the excellent work they do for the racing industry. This year’s November meeting will be held on a Saturday instead of a week day due to the NZTR Strategic Committee putting the importance of running Saturday meetings at premier venues a priority. This enables us to be a part of “Xmas at the Races” which involves 55 events throughout the country. I would like to personally thank Brent Wall for his support which saw the Rangitikei Racing club gain this day.

Finally the success of our race days would not have occurred without the dedicated efforts of the committee and I would like to acknowledge the endeavors of my committee and the ongoing support of their wives and partners. A great deal of voluntary time is contributed by the members to make the meetings successful and those contributions are greatly appreciated. A special thanks to my Vice Presidents John Turkington, Gerry Scully, Tim Harris and Bryce Newman. Gerry Scully is retiring from the committee after many years of loyal service and I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the club to thank him for that.

As this will be my final report as President, I would like to extend my thanks to the members for giving me the privilege of being your President for the last 5 years. I have enjoyed my 30 plus years on the committee and the opportunity to be involved in an industry that I am so passionate about.

PRESIDENT’S REPORTS CONT.

OTAKI-MAORI RACING CLUB (INC)

The 2012/2013 Season has been a very positive one for the Otaki-Maori RC the highlight being the Haunui Farm Group I WFA Classic run this season on the 23rd of February. Whilst the field was small, the quality was undeniable, with the race recently being named as the country’s top rating for the season which is a tremendous honour for the club. The other highlight, of what was overall a very good season, was the continued growth of our Interislander Summer Festival raceday held on the 4th of January. This year the crowd topped 5,500 and with this raceday catering for the whole family, it continues to go from strength to strength.

The Club would like to send their condolences to all those members and associates of the club who lost Family Members throughout the season, our thoughts have been with you.

As touched on above the Interislander Summer Festival Raceday at the beginning of January has become a permanent entry on many families’ calendars and the fact that this day continues to grow is testament to the hard work of the whole team. We see this day as one to attract people back to our course, there is a large investment in Children’s Entertainment on this day with the express aim of making it a Fun, safe and affordable day out for the whole whanau. The feedback we have had post event has been amazing with everybody leaving the course with a smile on their faces which is our aim here at the club. On-course Betting Turnover on this day was a very pleasing \$180,000, up \$20,000 on the previous year.

It was tremendous news to receive that our own Haunui Farm WFA Classic was the country’s highest rating race under the ANZ Ratings which is the system that all the country’s Group and Listed races are rated. The Haunui Farm Group I WFA Classic rated 117.5, the only race in the country to rate above 117. The Club would also like to thank Haunui Farm for their continued support of the race, the club cannot continue to achieve these results without the support of sponsors such as Haunui Farm. Not only from the financial sense but Haunui Farm also host all their Central districts clients on the day which adds to the colour of the day. We also held our annual Members’ Breakfast with over 200 people turning up for what was a very entertaining morning, leading into a spectacular day of the top quality Horse Racing and Live Music.

The Otaki-Maori RC also ran our first Melbourne Cup Race Day. With Mediaworks support on the day we had a very strong turnout, we see this as an event that will continue to grow as we provide a taste of Flemington in Otaki on the day when racing is at the forefront throughout the country.

The Club undertook a major drainage project at the beginning of May; the area from the winning post to past the original Mile Chute had been a constant issue for the club over the

past few seasons. This project was funded by the DIA Racing Safety Development Fund, First Sovereign Trust and NZ Thoroughbred Racing and the Club would like to take the opportunity to thank these organisations for their support during this project. The drainage work took a little longer to be completed than hoped due to the weather conditions around the time of the project. This left the club with no option but to transfer the last 2 meetings of the season, the May licence was taken up by another Club and unfortunately our last raceday of the season due to be run at Trentham coincided with a massive storm hitting the capital and the club was left with no option but to abandon.

The club like to make special mention of Cavallo Agistment, Mark Benton and Mediaworks who have once again been great sponsors, and done a great deal in the promoting of our racedays, The Dominion Post, and Long Time Supporter Pat Baker from El Cheapo Cars for his long standing sponsorship of the iconic Raukawa Cup raceday, which unfortunately we were unable to run this season but are looking for a suitable date for the current season.

The Club achieved a very pleasing raceday profit of \$119,211 which was slightly down on budget mainly due to our final two racedays of the year not being run. We have secured a new Saturday Date for the coming season, 19 October, and we will look to grow further on our racedays. Since April we have had the services of Kristine Jones full time in our Office, Kristine has done some very good work getting the profile of the club out in the community and we hope to continue to grow on this support in the coming season. The RACE Group also has a new CEO Alasdair Robertson who started in August. Alasdair has been the CEO of Perth and Melbourne Racing Clubs, he has an impressive CV and we look forward to working closely with him going forward to take the Club to the next level.

Finally I would like to thank all the stewards of the club and their partners for all their support and the hospitality they provide all patrons of the course. Special thanks to Rangi Ransfield and Tom Jamison for their work and support on the RACE Board. With the significant improvements in the Racing Surface, a new CEO and improved dates, I feel that this coming season will be one of the best at the Club.

WELLINGTON RACING CLUB (INC)

Blessed by good weather at virtually all of our meetings, it has been another successful season for the Club. As a Committee, we see our first goal as being to provide quality horse racing for the enjoyment of our members and for the benefit of the industry. As members, we are very fortunate to have one of Australasia’s great racecourses. The decisions in previous years to make track improvements, at considerable cost, have been vindicated as we continued to attract quality horses and provide a quality racing surface.

Yet again our prestige races were won by some great horses including Final Touch (Captain Cook and Telegraph), Weismuller (Wellington Stakes), More Than Sacred (NZ Oaks), Blood Brotha (Wellington Cup) and Historian (Thorndon Mile). Our Wellington Cup Carnival goes from strength to strength with this year on and off course turnover increasing by \$219,000 to \$9.6M.

Our Captain Cook Stakes, Oaks Day and winter meetings all showed significant turnover increases. We have continued to build on our December Christmas at the Races Day to the point where it is now our second biggest hospitality day.

We continue to operate in a challenging environment. Quite apart from the Global Financial Crisis, we have to compete with other sports and events for a reduced sponsorship pool. The days of horse racing, betting and attendance being one of the few options for the discretionary leisure spend are long gone. We are fortunate that in our corporate boxes and other amenities, we are still able to offer high quality entertainment.

The financial cost of operating the Clubs within the RACE group continues to rise and it is an ongoing challenge for all of the member Clubs to operate on a profitable basis.

Both as a Club, and at RACE group level, our racing operations continue to be profitable. We are the envy of clubs around the country. RACE, as a group, continues to battle with legacy high debt levels. Land sales at Palmerston North over the last year and relatively low interest rates have reduced the impact of that burden. It nevertheless continues to limit the expenditure on amenities and infrastructure that the Committee would like to see.

No report would be complete without thanking our sponsors. We have a very loyal group of sponsors, who each year, make a

significant contribution to the stakes we need to pay to attract quality fields. In particular I would like to thank Pacific Jewellers for its continuing partnership of the Wellington Cup. We are very fortunate to have on our Committee Des Coppins, who continues to lead the way in attracting sponsors.

At an industry level, the challenges facing Racing remain much as they were a year ago. The cost of horse ownership is considerable. The industry can only be sustained by providing stakes at a level that encourage and retain interest in horse ownership. The initiatives of NZTR in raising stakes for the coming season are welcome, as is the introduction of the Pearl Bonus series for fillies. Challenges continuing to face the industry and the Club include attracting more of the general public outside of our major race days.

The spirit of co-operation that exists between the Central Districts clubs was evidenced in the recent announcement that the Levin Racing Club Group I Levin Classic will now be run at Trentham on Telegraph Day 2014. With two Group 1s, a Group 2, a Group 3 and a Listed stakes race, we can look forward to a spectacular day’s racing.

The RACE group have been very fortunate to be able to appoint Alasdair Robertson as our new CEO and we look forward to gaining the benefit of his considerable experience in the industry in Australia. We are ably assisted at Trentham by our loyal staff whose contribution is regularly above and beyond the call of duty. On behalf of all members of the Club, I pass on our appreciation of their efforts. I would also like to thank Vice President Wayne Guppy and the Committee. They contribute countless hours to ensure racing at Trentham carries on and maintains the fine tradition of quality horse racing at the country’s premier horse racing venue.

Finally, I would like to conclude by thanking all members for the support they have shown during the year, particularly through their increased attendance.

RACING REVIEW

The RACE Group Of Clubs was scheduled to hold forty racemeetings during the 2012/2013 Racing Season. However with vital drainage work undertaken at the end of April at Otaki, the Group ran thirty-eight racedays for the season.

The first Black type race for the Group occurred at Awapuni for the Marton Jockey Club. The Group Three, Merial Ancare Metric Mile was a very even line up and run on a Heavy 10 track. The locals would take the spoils with Dubai Belle prepared by Awapuni trainer Tony Bambry, prevailing in a tight finish over Amberio with Superturf running third.

Better track conditions would be a pleasant change for horses at the Wellington Racing Club Labour weekend raceday. The Stephen Marsh trained Ruud Awakening would give an early warning to other two year olds that she was the real deal when winning the Listed Seaton Park Wellesly Stakes. In the hands of Jason Waddell she would win very easily by just over two lengths. At the end of the season she would be crowned New Zealand's leading two year old. In the Group Three, Graeme Thomson Antique

Jewellery Thompson Handicap patrons would get to see the real ability of Pero. He would prevail in an Awapuni trained trifecta over the Lisa Latta stablemates, Zennista and Platinum Princess. For trainer Trina Riddell, it was a relief after the horse had disappointed a week earlier in the Egmont Cup when sent out favourite. A near capacity field would assemble for the Group Two New Zealand Bloodstock Wellington Guineas. Neo, prepared by Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman, would hold too many guns for Zinko and Batman in a great finish.

The Feilding JC would have the closest finish of the season in any black type race. Northern visitors, Savvy Dancer dead heated with Jeu De Cartes with a nose back to Spiro in the Listed Ricoh Feilding Gold Cup. Many thought they had witnessed a triple dead heat when they hit the line in what was a thrilling race. Another northern visitor, Lady Kipling would show her class in taking out the Courtesy Ford Red Craze Bowl from local Aldebaran Star in the other feature race on the day.

In December the Group One Westbury Stud Captain Cook Stakes would see Mufhasa try to defend his title but he had to bow to Southern superstar, Final Touch. Given a gem of a ride by Chris Johnson, she would come with a barn storming run to score by a length and a half at the line from Lady Kipling and Mufhasa. Also on the day the John Bary trained Recite would make her debut and begin her unbeaten run as a two year old which would climax in Group One victory at Awapuni in her fourth start.

The three day Manawatu RC Christmas Carnival again brought exciting black type action. The first day would see the Graeme & Debbie Rogerson trained Soriano take out the Group Three Ezibuy Eulogy Stakes from Southern filly, Emerald Queen and

Central District's Lovetessa. Also on the day, Awapuni trained Ransomed would give all his rivals a big warning that he was on target for the Manawatu Cup when winning the MacDonald Manawatu Cup Prelude.

A Good 3 track would greet runners on the second day of the carnival. The Group Three, Hotel Coachman Manawatu Cup was won by the local Ransomed prepared by Gary Vile backing up from his win the previous weekend. Two races later racegoers witnessed Mufhasa at his best as he dispatched a top field in the Tods Seeds Manawatu Challenge Stakes. He would defeat Better

Than Ever and Final Touch after showing a clean pair of heels in front. It was truly the highlight of the three day carnival.

Perfect track conditions again met runners for Marton JC Premier raceday in January with a Dead 4 track upgraded to Good 3 during the day. The Listed Gallagher Marton Cup was won by local Ransomed who maintained a long sustained run when looking in a hopeless position at the back of midfield at the 600 metre mark. The Manawatu/Marton Cup double had not been achieved since 1997 and the victory showed he was a top class stayer in the making and was a credit to the training abilities of local trainer, Gary Vile.

The Pacific Jewellers Wellington Cup Carnival would again provide outstanding racing as well as big crowds. The Group One J&N Berkett Telegraph Handicap was taken out by Southern superstar Final Touch. This was her second Group One win at Trentham. After three Group One victories during the season, she would be crowned New Zealand's leading sprinter for the season. Xanadu would be the bridesmaid yet again in a Group One and Burgundy would end up third. O'Fille would show she would be a big threat in the Wellington Cup with victory in the Group Two Mills Reef Winery Trentham Stakes run at set weight & penalties conditions. The Group Three Wellington Stakes would see an upset with an easy victory to Weismuller over Lucky Country and Sam Mesi. The Group Two Little Avondale Stud Wakefield Challenge Stakes would see Recite maintain her unbeaten record with a two and a half length victory over Charlestown and Delzzup. The Listed 2013 Queensland Winter Racing Carnival Anniversary was taken out by the Jason Bridgeman trained Glade who held off a strong challenge from Sangster and Estrato.

Pacific Jewellers Wellington Cup day brought a good track and a fine day. Lovestessa would score an exciting nose victory over Soriano who was a further nose in front of Lucky Country in the Group Three Tiger Prawn Desert Gold Stakes. The \$200,000 Group Two Pacific Jewellers Wellington Cup saw Blood Brotha showed his liking for staying races when winning from Annie Higgins and Dolmabache. Blood Brotha would continue another lap of the track before rider Lisa Allpress could bring him back under control and return to the birdcage. For trainer Raymond Connors, the win capped off a great three months with the horse having earlier won the New Zealand Cup in November. The Group One Harcourts Thorndon Mile would see jockey Rosie Myers secure back to back Thorndon Mile when winning aboard Historian from Lady Kipling and Miss Pelear. Historian had been runner up behind Jimmy Choux in a NZ Derby before going to Hong Kong to race. But after leg issues he returned to New Zealand and it was a measure of Gary Alton's ability as a trainer that he got him back racing, yet alone winning a Group One.

The Haunui Farm Otaki-Maori Group One WFA was rated New Zealand's best race for the season. It was no wonder

when you looked at the five runners headed by Cox Plate winner Ocean Park, triple Group One victor Final Touch as well as Veyron, Better Than Ever and Nashville. It would be the up and comer Nashville, in the hands of jockey Kelly Myers, who proved too strong in the finish to down Veyron and Better Than Ever. Ocean Park would end up fourth, with Final Touch last and just two and half lengths from the winner.

The Northern Stables would run the trifecta in the Wellfield New Zealand Oaks held in the autumn by the Wellington Racing Club. More Than Sacred, ridden by Leith Innes and trained by Tony Pike and Mike Donoghue, would prove too strong in the finish for The Oaks Stud owned pair of Blanket Bay and Aurora Lights. Unfortunately a wet track would prevent More Than Sacred showing her best form in Australia. O'Fille would prove how unlucky she was in the Wellington Cup by winning the Cuddle Stakes very easily from Denlee over the 1600m. The NZ St Leger would go to the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman trained Serpent while the South Island would take away the Sakhee Secret Melbourne Racing Club Lightning Handicap with the handy sprinter Natuzzi prepared by Paul Richards at Wingatui.

The Manawatu Racing Club never fails to deliver with top class racing action at its biggest day of the year and in 2013 this would prove no different. The \$225,000 Oaks Stud Manawatu Sires Produce Stakes is the richest, Group One, two-year-old race in New Zealand and it was fitting it would be taken out by the sponsor with their horse Recite. Recite was recording her fourth win on end for The Oaks Stud. This was owner, Dick Karremen's first time at Awapuni and he could not have picked a better time to be present. General Manager of The Oaks Stud, Ric Williams would have the distinction of presenting the trophy to his boss, Dick Karremen. The Group Two Lawnmaster Awapuni Gold Cup would see a fantastic finish as the Jason Bridgeman trained Better Than Ever would hold out Ransomed and Spiro in a stirring finish. The Group Three Higgins Manawatu Classic would see three top horses dominating the finish. Survived, who dumped jockey Jonathan Riddell in the prelim, would come with a paralysing burst to beat Usanity and Platinum Kingdom. All three would go on to perform with distinction in Australia in the autumn and winter. The Listed Fairdale/Goodwood Studs Flying Handicap would see the class galloper Burgundy prevail just over top mare I Do, giving trainer Jason Bridgeman two black type wins on the programme. For Burgundy this would be the last time we would see him on the track as he was retired two days later due to an injury picked up in the race and he went to Stud.

The New Zealand Bloodstock Insurance Manawatu Breeders would see class mare O'Fille back up her Cuddle Stakes win over Jeu De Cartes. The NZ Pattern Review Committee has just recently upgraded this race to Group 3 next season, given its strong runnings in the last three years. The Listed ITM Manawatu ANZAC Mile would see the Kevin Gray trained

mare Testa Secret beat a game I Do and Innovation in the traditional ANZAC raceday for the Feilding Jockey Club.

Lisa Latta would again hold the key to Listed James Bull Rangitikei Gold Cup at the Rangitikei RC May meeting winning it for the second year in a row. Her handy mare Sacha would take the spoils from Art Beat and Innovation. Awapuni was treated to some of New Zealand's best jumpers in June with both big Waikato jumps winners coming to Awapuni. The Kevin Myers trained Rioch, who had won the Waikato Steeplechase very easily, would destroy the LJ Hooker Manawatu Steeplechase field by twenty-two and a half lengths. Graeme and Debbie Rogerson would train the Manawatu ITM Awapuni Hurdle winner with Zenocoin who would beat the Waikato Hurdle winner Sea King.

July always brings spectacular jumping action around the figure eight and this year's edition was just as exciting with three chances going into the last fence in the Grant Plumbing Wellington Steeplechase. It was the Mark Oulaghan trained Brushman, who would prevail for the second time in his career over a gallant Solid Steel and Shooting Daggers. In the Natural Farms Wellington Hurdles, That's David would lead all the way with a proficient jumping display when scoring from favourite Waitaha Toa.

FINANCE REVIEW

RACE has posted a net loss of \$133,997 before depreciation for the year ended 31 July 2013. This compares to a \$207,873 net surplus last year. After depreciation the total loss for the year is \$780,942 compared to a loss of \$604,940 in 2012.

The budgeted surplus for the 2013 year was \$200,245 (before depreciation), which results in an actual negative variance to budget of \$334,242. The majority of this variance can be attributed to three areas: Grants income, down \$104k; net racing industry income, down \$112k; and Trentham Gardens Catering, down \$94k. Those three areas are also a combined \$362k behind the 2012 results. On a positive note we have sold all the remaining sections in the Grand Oaks development. Seven were realised in the 2013 accounts with five more settling after balance date.

RACEMEETING STATEMENT

The surplus from racing was \$1,790,901 compared to last year's result of \$2,175,445, which is down \$385k. A major contributor to this variance was race day grants income, which were down \$115k. Grants became increasingly difficult to secure as the year progressed and for a large part of the season access to grants for racing clubs was put on hold. It is looking more positive as we enter the 2014 season but declining grants income is still a major threat to racing clubs. The other area for concern is that although thoroughbred industry distributions from the NZRB have increased in recent year's club funding hasn't grown at the same pace. Couple this with a reduction in nomination and acceptance fee income and higher stakes levels (we paid out \$7.626m in stakes this season, up \$218k from last season on two less race meetings) and the result is not favourable. We agree that stake money increases are vital but they cannot be to the detriment of the clubs who must provide and maintain the multi-million dollar facilities at which these races are run. Another comment on the race meeting account worth

mentioning is the drop of admission income, from \$314,475 to \$281,239. This does not reflect a general decline in attendance but can be attributed entirely to the reduced ticket sales to the 'Pure Pavilion' on Wellington Cup Day. Adjusting for that, admission income for the year was ahead of 2012.

CATERING

Creative Catering returned a profit of \$298,238 compared to \$313,270 last year. That produced a total net return to RACE of \$249,119. Turnover was \$1.958m compared to \$2.027m in 2012. Whilst it was disappointing not to hit the \$2m turnover and \$300k profit barriers, it is a strong result which would have been stronger had it not been for the cancelation of several large jobs through the winter. The function and conference market is fiercely competitive in the Manawatu with other venues heavily discounting their room hire in order to attract business. We have been reluctant to adopt this strategy given we have the best venue in the region but we must be proactive to ensure we continue to be the preferred venue of choice.

Trentham Gardens returned a profit of \$66,011 compared to \$118,445 last year. Turnover was \$1.486m compared to \$1.517m in 2012. That gives a current year return on turnover of 4.4% which is clearly unacceptable. The main culprits are the casual wage costs and hireage costs, which combined were \$35k ahead of last year. These two areas continue to be the major focus of cost reduction for Trentham Gardens.

GRAND OAKS DEVELOPMENT

As mentioned earlier all sections have now been sold in this development. In total the 29 sections in Stage 3 realised \$5m (net of GST and commission) with total development costs of \$2.08m. The last section is due to settle on the 1st of December this year.

TRACK AND TRAINING

Net track and training costs amounted to \$238,272 compared to \$276,343 last year. A major cost saving was at Awapuni where the sand carpeting was not required this year, saving \$25k. Horse numbers were up considerably at Awapuni although down at Otaki and static at Trentham. Total track fees revenue increased by \$20k from last year to \$410,366.

FINANCING COSTS AND DEBT POSITION

Once again RACE has been fortunate that with its large debt burden interest rates have remained historically low. It cannot be expected that this will continue so it is imperative that we continue to look at strategies which will realise cash in the near term and reduce debt. Over the year debt has been reduced by \$1.7m and will reduce by a further \$840k in the coming months.

CASH FLOW STATEMENT

A cash flow statement is presented on page 28. It shows a big drop in net cash flows from operating activities of \$295,492 from \$629,794 last year. Whilst cash income is higher than last year that

is deceptive due to a change in the industry funding model to gross up income and bring back levies. On a net basis cash industry income (net of stakes paid) is down \$211k. The overall cash deficit for the year was \$7,612.

BALANCE SHEET

Cash on hand/bank accounts at balance date total \$442,864. That is almost identical to the position at 31 July 2012 which is positive given we recorded a large loss for the year.

Total debt at \$9.3m is \$1.7m less than at July 2012 and as mentioned will reduce further by the end of the calendar year.

Both the BNZ and NZRB loan facilities are due to expire during the 2014 financial year and management have already started presenting detailed funding proposals to the various institutions. We are confident of agreeing terms in the coming weeks.

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Reporting Entity

Racing at Awapuni, Otaki and Trentham Combined Enterprise Incorporated (RACE Inc) is an incorporated society established under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

RACE Incorporated is a formal partnership between the Manawatu Racing Club, Marton Jockey Club, Feilding Jockey Club, Rangitikei Racing Club, Wellington Racing Club and the Otaki-Maori Racing Club.

General Accounting Principles

These Financial Statements are prepared in terms of Section 28 (2) of the Racing Act 2003 and generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand with the Racing Act having preference.

The general accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of results and financial position on an historic cost basis have been consistently followed except as specifically mentioned below.

Specific Accounting Policies

RACE Incorporated qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and it does not qualify as large. The Club has applied the differential reporting exemptions allowed in relation to the following standards:

FRS 10: Statement of Cash Flows (with the exception of a Cash Flow Statement as presented)

FRS 31: Disclosure of Information about Financial Instruments

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at net realisable value.

Stock on Hand

Stock on Hand is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, Plant & Equipment is stated at acquisition cost to RACE Inc. Depreciation is provided at rates to write the assets off over the estimated life of those assets.

Kitchen Equipment is stated at acquisition cost and all replacements are written off in the year of purchase.

Property Intended for Sale

Property Intended for Sale is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Investments

Investments are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

GST

All transactions are recorded exclusive of GST and the refund due as at 31 July 2013 is included under Current Assets in the Statement of Financial Position.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies for RACE Inc during the period covered by these financial statements.

NOTE 2 - BORROWINGS

Bank of New Zealand

The term loans of \$5,773,000 relate to an \$8.82m facility arranged with the bank on 17th December 2008. This facility is for a period of five years, with a condition that all Grand Oaks section sales monies are utilised in reduction of this debt. The terms and interest rates are as follows:

- \$2,930,000 loan – Maturity date: 2 December 2013. Interest rate: 5.00%
- \$2,843,000 loan – Maturity date: 28 August 2013. Interest rate: 5.03%

The following guarantees are provided for the above loans:

- \$12,000,000 – Manawatu Racing Club, Wellington Racing Club, Rangitikei Racing Club, Feilding Jockey Club, Marton Jockey Club & Otaki-Maori Racing Club
- \$8,820,000 – New Zealand Racing Board.

The Bank of New Zealand holds first registered mortgages over Awapuni, Trentham and Otaki racecourses as well as property situated at Shirriffs Road and Pioneer Highway, Palmerston North and a perfected security interest in all acquired property of RACE Inc.

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing

The NZTR Trentham and Otaki track loans were re-documented and rolled into one loan during the year. The balance at 31 July 2013 is \$542,948 and the termination date is 1 May 2027. The interest rate at balance date is 3.61%.

New Zealand Racing Board

The NZRB has provided RACE with a \$3m five year working capital facility. As at balance date this facility was drawn to \$2,875,000 with accrued interest of \$122,794. The interest rate is 3.50%.

While the NZRB loan facility expires in February 2014, the Board is confident that the facility will be renegotiated and extended beyond twelve months and therefore consider it appropriate to disclose the debt as a non current liability.

The NZRB holds second priority registered mortgages over Awapuni, Otaki and Trentham racecourses.

NOTE 4 – INVESTMENTS

RACE Inc on behalf of the six member Clubs is a member of the Central Districts Cluster Partnership and holds an investment of \$29,263 (2012 - \$58,128).

NOTE 5 - COMMITMENTS

RACE Inc entered into an agreement on 26 August 2011 for the lease of new IT equipment at Awapuni and Trentham. The term is 36 months.

RACE Inc entered into an agreement on 5 May 2011 for the lease of two new photocopiers at Awapuni and Trentham. The term is 60 months.

NOTE 6 – RELATED PARTIES

Board member John Henderson is a partner of law firm Evans Henderson Woodbridge who have provided legal services to RACE during the year. RACE has also purchased products from Ravensdown Fertiliser Co-op Ltd of whom John Henderson is a director.

Board member Graeme Martin is the owner of Martin Engineering who provided engineering services at Awapuni during the year.

Various Board members and their associated entities may have also provided sponsorship monies for race meetings during the year.

All of the above transactions are within the normal conditions of trading.

NOTE 7 – CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

There are no known contingent liabilities as at balance date (2012: Nil).

NOTE 8 - REVENUE

Race Inc had a total income for the 2013 season of \$17,181,969 (2012 - \$17,375,133). Included in this is \$1,115,052 (2012 - \$1,100,087) of charges between the various RACE divisions.

NOTE 9 – EARTHQUAKE PRONE BUILDINGS

Wellington Racing Club has received notification from Upper Hutt City Council regarding the assessment of earthquake prone buildings. RACE has significant building infrastructure at Trentham with a book value of \$7.8m. The Upper Hutt City Council desktop assessments indicate that most buildings are below the minimum safety threshold and for financial reporting purposes this could result in a significant impairment to the valuation of these buildings.

RACE has engaged an engineer and an initial assessment indicates that the buildings could meet the code. A full engineer's report will be completed by the end of 2013. Once this is done and if required, an exercise to assess the value of any impairment for these buildings will be carried out and therefore any such associated financial impact cannot be quantified in these financial statements.

AUDITOR'S REPORT
To the Members of Racing at Awapuni, Otaki and Trentham Combined Enterprise Inc



We have audited the financial statements of RACE, which comprises of the statement of financial position as at 31 July 2013, the statement of financial performance, the statement of movements in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended. These include a summary of significant accounting policies and are prepared in accordance with Section 28 (2) of the Racing Act 2003.

Boards' Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Board is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand and for such internal control as the Board determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error:

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Other than in our capacity as auditor of Wellington Racing Club, Rangitikei Racing Club, Otaki Maori Racing Club, Manawatu Racing Club, Marton Jockey Club and Feilding Jockey Club, we have no relationship with, or interests in, RACE.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As disclosed in the financial statements in note 9, Wellington Racing Club has received notification from Upper Hutt City Council regarding a desktop assessment of earthquake prone buildings. RACE has significant building infrastructure at Trentham. The Upper Hutt City Council assessment indicates that most buildings are below the minimum safety threshold and for financial reporting purposes this could result in a significant impairment to the valuation of these buildings. An exercise to assess the value of any impairment for these buildings has not yet been carried out and therefore the associated financial impact cannot be quantified in these financial statements.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of RACE as at 31 July 2013 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended, in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand and Section 28 (2) of the Racing Act 2003.

Emphasis of Matter

As disclosed in Note 2 of the financial statements, the \$2.99 million loan from the New Zealand Racing Board expires in February 2014. The Board believes the facility will be renegotiated for a term beyond 12 months from the date of these financial statements, and therefore considers it appropriate to continue disclosing the loan as a term liability. RACE relies on the continued support from its funders to adopt the going concern assumption.
